

CITY OF JUNEAU ORDINANCES

| ORDINANCE # | DESCRIPTION | |
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| 6.04.010 Dog and cat licenses required | All dogs & cats must be registered within the city limits. Inside cats must also be registered. | Registration deadline is March 31 st of each year |
| 6.04.020 Rabies vaccination required for license. | Rabies vaccinations must be obtained prior to a dog or cat license being issued. | If vaccinations are current all you have to do is register the animal |
| 6.04.040 Late fees. | A late fee of \$25 will be assessed for each animal not registered by March 31 st of each year | |
| Animals Running at Large. | No dogs or cats are allowed to run at large unless under the control of the owner. | A \$20 dog pickup fee will be charged to the pet owner. Animals not claimed will be turned over to the Dodge County Human Society. |
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| 6.04.100 Animal feces. | Animal feces must be picked up immediately after the animal has defecated on public or other people's property. Feces must be picked up within 24 hours on private property. | |
| 6.04.130 Prohibited and protected animals, reptiles | All poisonous animals and reptiles including rear-fang snakes & constrictor snakes are prohibited in the city. | |
| 6.04.190 Limitation on number of dogs and cats. | There shall be no more than 4 total animals (dogs or cats) per household within the city. | |
| Pet Fancier's License. | Any person desiring to own any more than 2 animals (dog or cat) must apply for a pet fancier license. No person shall own more than a total of four animals at a residence. | Cost of a Pet Fancier's license is \$20 per year |
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| | 8.08.010 Public nuisances prohibited. | |
| Destruction of Noxious Weeds. | All property owners are to keep their properties free of any noxious weeds. This means, any weeds above 8" in height to include; flower beds, around trees, exterior buildings, grass on lawns. | The Weed Commission will observe all properties within the city and will take appropriate action to notify the property owner to get the weeds trimmed. Failure to do so will result in the city taking action in the cutting of the weeds where the property owner will be billed. |
| Public Nuisances Affecting Peace and Safety | All trees, hedges which prevent persons driving vehicles on public streets, alleys or highways from obtaining a clear view of traffic when approaching an intersection or pedestrian crosswalk and all limbs of trees which project over and are less than ten feet above the surface of a public sidewalk or street or other place must be trimmed. | |
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| 9.04.020 Throwing or shooting of arrows, stones and other missiles prohibited. | No person shall throw or shoot, arrows, stones or other missiles within the city limits. | |
| 9.04.030 Sale and discharge of fireworks restricted. | Even though fireworks can be purchased in the State of Wisconsin, it is illegal to shoot fireworks off within the city limits of Juneau. | Any firework that leaves the ground shooting into the air and makes a banging noise is considered illegal. |
| 9.04.040 Burning | The burning of garbage, leaves, and other materials other than for campfire purposes are prohibited within the city limits. Burning pits cannot exceed 36" in diameter | |
| The keeping of garbage and refuse. | All garbage shall be placed at the curb not earlier than twelve (12) hours prior to the schedule date of collection. All containers shall be removed from the curb not later than twenty-four (24) hours after the date of collection. | |
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| <p>10.08.020 Abandoned vehicles</p> | <p>No disassembled, inoperable, unlicensed, junked or wrecked motor vehicles, tractors and/or trailers shall be stored or allowed to remain in the open upon public or private property within the city for more than 3 days if upon public property or streets, and more than 30 days if upon private property.</p> <p>Definitions: Disassembled, inoperable, junked or wrecked motor vehicles, tractors and/or trailers" means being in such a state of physical or mechanical ruin as to be incapable of propulsion or being operated upon the public streets or highways. Unlicensed motor vehicles, tractors and/or trailers" means any motor vehicle not bearing lawful current license plates.</p> | |
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| <p>Winter Overnight Parking.</p> | <p>No person shall park any vehicle on any street in the city between 2 a.m. & 6 a.m. from November 15 to April 15. Official traffic signs are erected on all state and county trunk highways at the limits of the city informing the public of this ordinance.</p> | |
| <p>12.08.090 Snow and ice removal</p> | <p>Sidewalks to be Kept Clear. The owner or occupant of any lot or parcel shall within (24) hours after a snowfall remove all snow and ice which has fallen or accumulated upon the entire sidewalk (sidewalk includes the paved extension of a public sidewalk to the traveled portion of a street) in front of such lot or parcel. When ice has formed that cannot be removed, the owner or occupant shall keep the same sprinkled with a material which will prevent the sidewalk from being dangerous to pedestrians.</p> | <p>Snow Not to be Deposited on the Streets. The owner or occupant of any lot or parcel shall not be allowed to deposit snow on the street if a lawn or area is available between the sidewalk and the street.</p> <p>Fire Hydrant. The owner or occupant of any property which abuts a fire hydrant shall refrain from obstructing the hydrant or access to the hydrant in any way, and shall remove all snow from the hydrant within twenty-four (24) hours of a snowfall and keep the hydrant free of snow at all times.</p> |
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| <p>12.08.095 Grass clippings.</p> | <p>No property owner or occupant required to mow grass shall permit grass trimmings resulting from mowing of lawns or tree borders to be deposited onto the travelable portion of any street, public alley or public parking lot. The presence of grass trimmings for a period in excess of 2 hours upon the public property shall be conclusive evidence of the depositor's intent not to remove them.</p> | |
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| <p>15.04.030 Building permits.</p> | <p>Permit Required. No building or structure or any part thereof shall be built, enlarged, improved, altered, demolished or ground broken for the same within the city until a permit has been obtained by the owner or his authorized agent from the building inspector. The permit shall be posted in a prominent place on the premises prior to and during the period of construction, alteration, repair or demolition.</p> | <p>Minor Repairs. No building permit shall be required for any minor repair or alteration which does not change the occupancy area, structural strength, fire protection or exits of the building when the cost is less than five hundred dollars (\$500.00).
